Century House Plaques

Thank you for applying for a Heritage Toronto Century House Plaque.

The Century House program offers Torontonians who own houses built 100 or more years ago the chance to apply for a custom-made historical marker commemorating their property's longevity.

Each Century House plaque is made of durable enamel and measures 11 ¼ inches x 9 ¾ inches. In addition to highlighting your property as a centenarian, the plaque also doubles as a street address marker.

A fee of \$250, payable to Heritage Toronto, covers the research, fabrication, and shipment of the plaque to your home.

Please note, however, that receiving a Century House plaque does not mean your house will be listed or designated on the City of Toronto's Inventory of Heritage Properties.

This historical marker will serve as official recognition of your home's contribution to the establishment of your community and to the built heritage of the city of Toronto.

A charitable agency of the City of Toronto with origins dating back to 1949, Heritage Toronto works to promote Toronto's archaeological, built, cultural, and natural heritage.

Through the Historical Plaques and Markers Program, we encourage and facilitate community involvement in the commemoration of Toronto's past.
