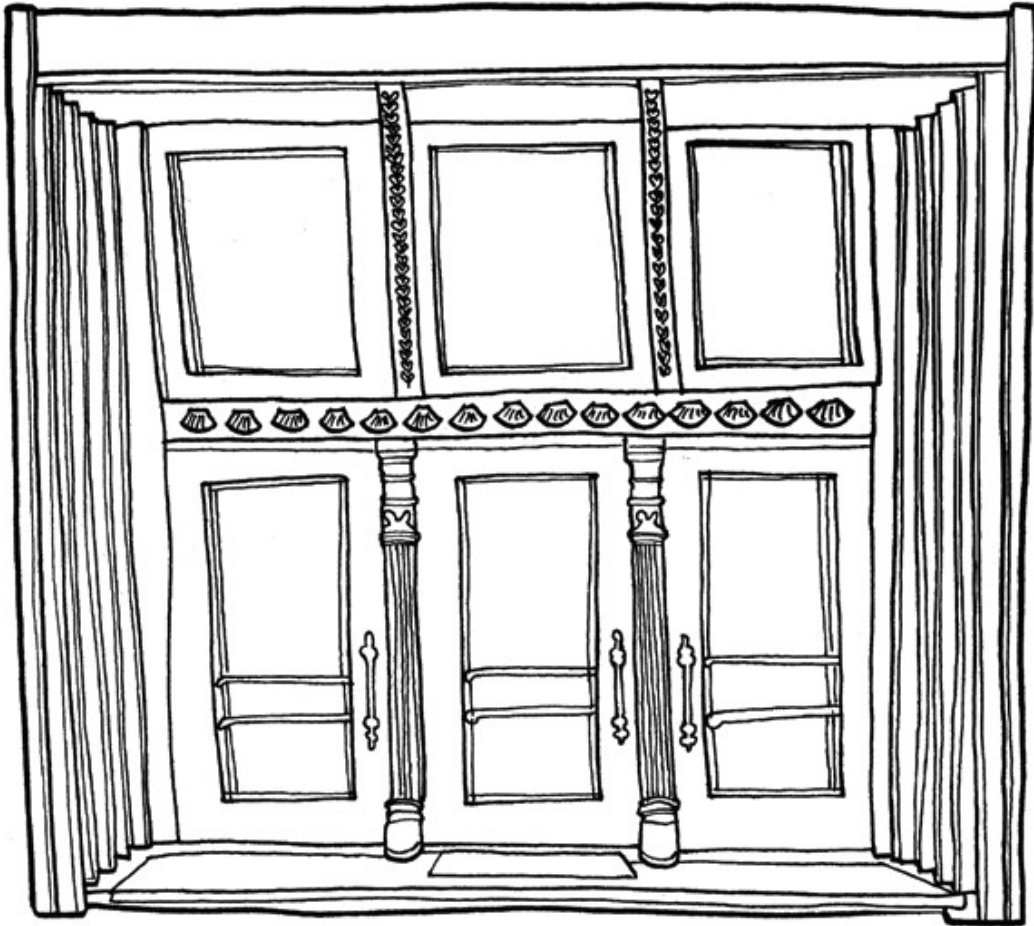

ARCHITECTURAL CONSERVATION & CRAFTSMANSHIP

ELIGIBILITY STANDARDS

This category recognizes building owners who have undertaken projects to conserve or adapt a historic building or architectural feature of a historic building within the municipal boundaries of the city of Toronto.

- The project must have been completed between January 1 2015 and December 31, 2016.
- The project may be of any scale, but the historic building should have been in existence for at least 40 years. If less than 40 years old, it must be included on the City of Toronto *Inventory of Heritage Properties*.
- Projects cannot have been previously nominated for a Heritage Toronto Award.
- The building owner must consent to the nomination.

The jury will consider the following criteria:

- **Integrity:** Does the project meet current needs while maintaining the integrity of the original design vision? Does the project demonstrate a high level of commitment to heritage conservation?
- **Craftsmanship:** Does the project demonstrate a high level of craftsmanship? Are the materials used appropriate?
- **Impact:** What is the impact of the project on the local community visually, historically, and/or functionally?
- **Compliance:** The degree to which the project complies with applicable sections of Heritage Toronto's *Heritage Conservation Principles* and the *Standards and Guidelines for the Conservation of Historic Places in Canada*, found at heritagetoronto.org.

NOMINATION PACKAGE

Please include the following in your submission:

- **Nomination Form:** [Found online here](#). Click on *Submit a Nomination* to complete the form.
- **Project Statement** (max 250 words): Include scope, scale, and a summary of why the project is deserving of recognition according to the eligibility standards and jury criteria. Include the original date of construction and architect/designer of the heritage building.
- **Conservation Description:** A detailed description of the existing conditions and conservation challenges faced during the project and an explanation, including annotated visuals of any engineering or conservation techniques used to meet these challenges, as well as a list of any heritage consultants and craftspersons who worked on the project.
- **Media:** High resolution (300 dpi) image(s), video, interviews, etc. as appropriate. The submission should be thorough enough to provide the jury with sufficient evidence and a clear understanding of the character-defining elements, context, and value of the project without requiring a site-visit.
 - Submission **must include** 'before and after' views, principal elevations, character-defining details, and context-setting street photographs of the building/structure.
 - Submission **must include** logos of relevant project partners (architecture firm, developer, craftspersons, etc.)
